**ROMANIA**—**Hona Veres** is organising a Bible Club in Mera, **27 July**—**1 August**, with the help of a team from the Swiss Reformed Church. The theme is 'All Change' and they will be looking at different characters whose lives were transformed by Jesus. **Pray for:** the preparations; for good attendance by the children; and that each of them will be transformed by Jesus. The Annual National IKE Youth Festival, **31 July**—**4 August**, with the motto, Closer to you Lord' and teaching and workshops will reflect the theme. Youth groups from all over Transylvania attend this four day event. Pray for the preparations for the IKE Festival; pray for **clear teaching** and powerful times of worship and for the young people to sense the power and presence of the Lord and to submit to His purpose for their lives.

SAT-7—The rapid advance of militant forces led by ISIS (Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant) in Iraq has caused international alarm. The developments will be of urgent concern to many SAT-7 viewers in Iraq, where 1 in 3 children watch the SAT-7 KIDS channel and a devoted adult audience watch SAT-7 ARABIC. World Watch Monitor reported on Tuesday 10 June that up to 1,000 Christian families had fled Mosul. Chaldean Archbishop Amel Nona, told Aid to the Church in Need (11 June) that he thought Mosul's last remaining Christians had left the city, which was once home to 35,000 Christians, after they received threats. "Many have flooded into Christian villages in the neighbouring plains and are sheltering in schools, and empty homes," he said. A few weeks ago, SAT -7 Chief Executive Dr Terence Ascott and colleagues visited Baghdad and said how impressed he was to see the positive attitude of the government towards Christians and their real desire to get Christians to stop leaving the country and offering churches around-the-clock security. He also spoke of their keenness to offer SAT-7 assistance in providing resources for programme making and possible live broadcasts. Now there is such a change for the worse. Pray that as sectarian conflict increases SAT-7's programmes would give encouragement and strength in Christ and His Word. Pray that the Lord Jesus would reveal himself to those who are seeking spiritual truth. Pray for church leaders in Iraq as they minister to their congregations at this very difficult time.
